WHAT DOES SEXUAL ORIENTATION MEAN?

Each person is unique and has the ability to feel attracted to another person, in other words their sexual orientation. The different types of sexual orientation include:


- Heterosexuality: a woman who loves and is attracted to a man or a man who loves and is attracted to a woman.
- Homosexuality: a woman who loves and is attracted to another woman or a man who loves and is attracted to another man.
- **Bisexuality**: a woman who loves and is attracted to both men and women or a man who loves and is attracted to both women and men.
- Pansexuality: a person who loves and is attracted to somebody regardless of their sex or gender.
- Asexuality: a person who does not experience towards individuals of any gender.

WHAT DOES GENDER IDENTITY MEAN?

Each person is assigned a gender at birth, male or female. However, not everyone identifies with the gender recorded on their birth certificate. Some people even do not identify at all with either of the two gender possibilities. That is why more and more often we hear about gender identity. Here are some gender identities:

CISGENDER	A person whose gender identity matches the biological sex they were assigned when they were born. (e.g. a female person who identifies as a woman.
TRANSGENDER BINARY	A person who feels the need to transition from one gender to another because they do not identify with the gender assigned at birth (e.g. a person who was assigned male at birth but identifies as female).
NON-BINARY TRANSGENDER	A person who rejects the clear distinction between male and female identities, or the "gender binary", and identifies with both some male and some female traits at the same time, in spite of the personal gender assigned at birth.
AGENDER	A person who does not identify with any gender

WHAT DOES LGBT+ MEAN?

Lesbian, word used forwomen who are attracted to other women.

Gay, meaning men who are attracted to other men.

- **Bisexual,** identifies people who are attracted to both men and women.
- **Transgender**, people who do not identify with the assigned gender at birth.

This **symbol** is used to include **all people** whose identities do not fit typical binary notions of male and female. Among the best known abbreviations we can mention:

- Queer, a term used to describe people who think of their sexual orientation or gender identity as outside of societal norms. Often used as a more fluid and inclusive term than the previous traditional categories.
- **Intersex**, someone who is born with a combination of primary and secondary sexual characteristics that do not fit typical binary notions of male or female bodies.
- stands for **Asexual**, people who do not feel sexual attraction, **Aromantic**, people who do not feel sentimental attraction and **Agender**, people who do not identify with any gender, some describe it as having a "lack of gender," while others describe themselves as being gender neutral.
